- All agriculture projects must be on the Navajo Nation
- Identification card/Driver's license
- Social security card
- W9 Form, applicants may receive a 1099 based on award amount
- Agriculture Land Use Permit (ALUP) if available
- Returning applicants must submit 2021 Crop Report
- 2022 AIF Crop report submission required upon harvest
